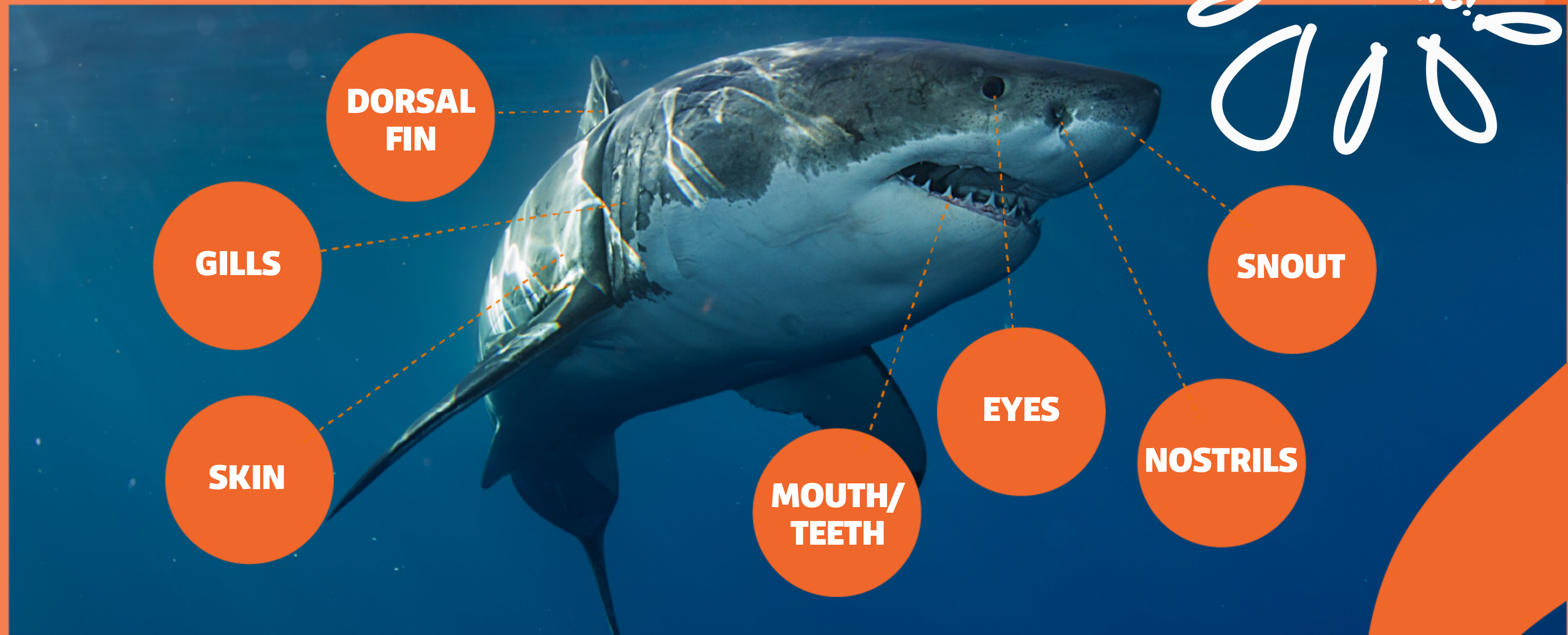

each other!**



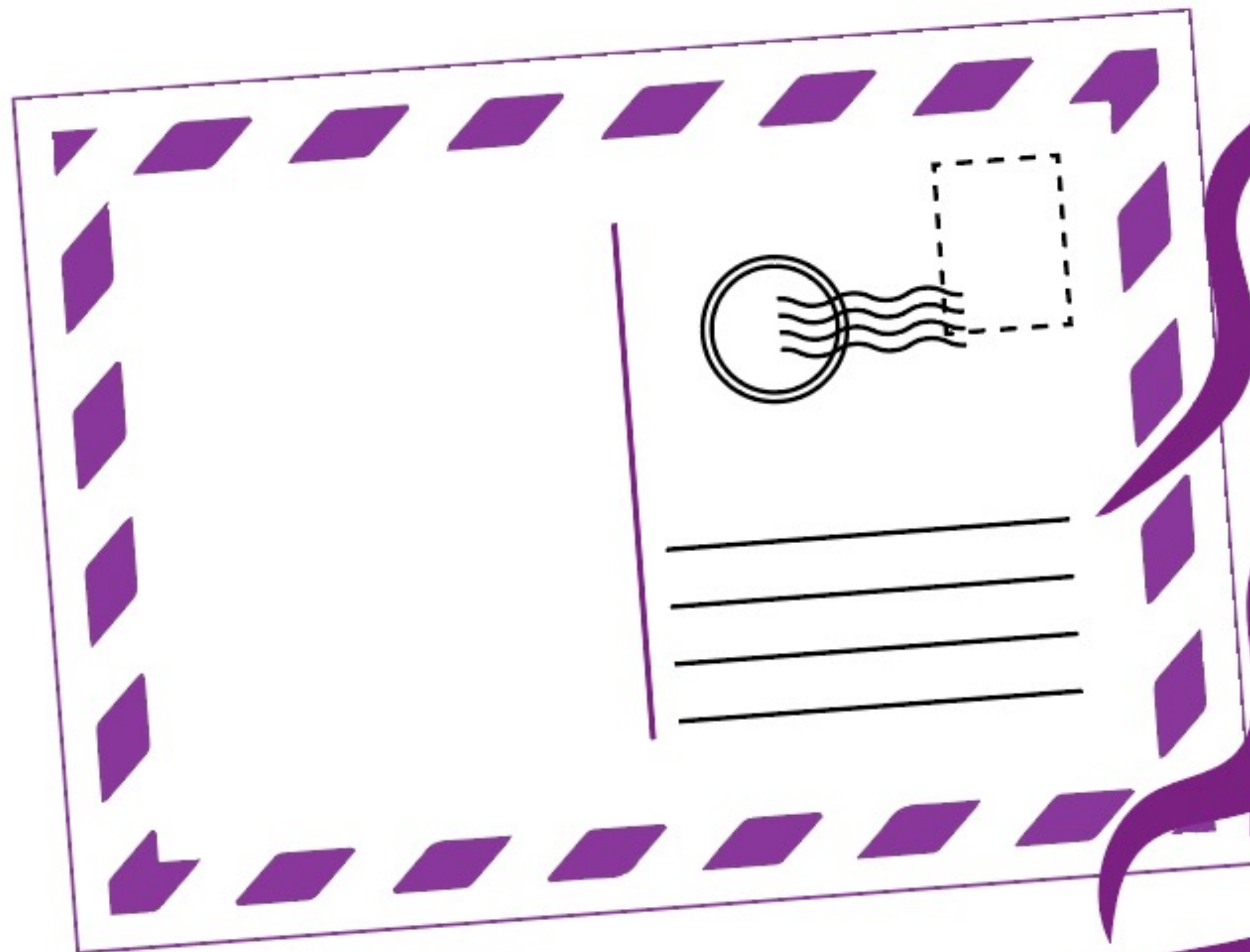
My Creature Postcard
